<u>LENDING LIBRARY</u>

There are several bookshelves in the main room of the fellowship hall that hold books donated to Saint Francis Church from various members. Most are religious in nature: the theology represented spans the gamut from Roman Catholicism and Orthodoxy to Reformed. There are even a few Anglican authors within the collection ;)

Although I cannot vouch for the usefulness of each publication, there are some books that I find worth mentioning; so I plan on contributing to our newsletter for awhile to give you my perspective on what is available for loan.

This month, I borrowed a book entitled <u>Six Ways to</u> <u>Pray from Six Great Saints.</u>

In 150 pages, the author introduces the reader to Francis and Clare of Assisi, Ignatius of Loyola, Therese of Lisieux, Teresa of Avila, and John of the Cross.

The introduction states, "All of them were once beginners; none of them has forgotten how to initiate others who think of themselves as amateurs."

After a very brief history of each saint, the reader is lead into meditations formulated from a particular saint's "style." The introduction explains: "These meditations are to be prayed, not just read. They require an active use of the imagination, the mind, and the will. The goal in each case is to seek God..."

At the end of each chapter is an "Exploring Further" section, offering a brief bibliography of sources that present in-depth study on the prayer form. This little book by Gloria Hutchinson is a good primer for beginners, but also it is a good refresher for a seasoned prayer. It was published in 1982.

Checking out books from the lending library is easy. There is a spiral notebook on one of the shelves. Please list the date, the name of the publication, and your name. There is no time limit, but if someone wants to read what you've borrowed and they see you have had it over a year (it happens), they will know whom to ask. Happy reading, Wanda


Worship:


