THANKSGIVING DAY, NOVEMBER 27

Each year we celebrate Thanksgiving Day in our nation, always on the fourth Thursday of November. At St. Francis we try to begin the day with a Holy Communion service so that we don't miss the real object of our Thanksgiving—the Giver of all good gifts. Even with the troubles we are experiencing in our country now, we have been and continue to be the most blessed nation on the face of the earth. That makes it incumbent upon us to acknowledge the one who has blessed us. I served at another parish many years ago where Thanksgiving Day was truly a parish celebration, almost

a Holy Day. The church was full at the Eucharist (700-800) and a collection was taken up for the St. Vincent de Paul Society whose ministry it was to serve the poor in the parish. Each year we collected enough money to operate St. Vincent de Paul for the entire year. The rationale behind the collection was obvious. Genuine thanksgiving always results in sharing with others. I would remind you that in addition to celebrating the day with family and friends, it would also be a great opportunity to remember others in some way who are less fortunate. The true nature of thanksgiving is giving. We will have our Holy Communion service at 10:00 am on the 27th. Please join us to give thanks to the Creator (Luke:6:38).

I am writing this before the end of our parish food drive for the benefit of The Storehouse in Pflugerville. It was my hope at the beginning of it that we would outdo our previous collections of food. I don't know how this will turn out but I am

grateful, as always, for your kindness and generosity. I continue to be amazed at the constant need for food in our community. For all the talk of the prosperity here in Austin, these needs seem not only to continue but to increase. I realize that Jesus said that we would always have the poor with us (and it is our responsibility to take care of them as we can) but is there something wrong when people who work very hard, sometimes with more than one job, find it difficult to put food on the table? I am not suggesting that government at any level try to fix such a problem. I don't believe they can. Nor do I believe that the government should enact legislation to take from the haves and give it to the havenots. That should always be voluntary. But I am suggesting that those of us who are doing OK or better than that should at least be aware of the needs of others and try to help when we are able. The food you have donated will help. But please take it upon yourselves to remember the poor at other times as well (Gal. 2:10).

Daylight Saving Time

Each year (when I think of it) I try to remind you when Daylight Saving Time begins and ends. I don't want anyone to miss church. Daylight Saving Time ends this year on November 2.

Before you retire on Saturday evening, November 1, please set your clocks <u>back</u> one hour. This is the time of year when you can pick up an extra hour of sleep, that is if you can sleep that long anyway.
