FROM THE RECTOR:

All Saints' Day

"Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us put away all that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles and run with perseverance the race marked out for us" (Hebrews 12:1). The great cloud of witnesses to whom the author of the Letter to the Hebrews refers is the reason for our celebrating this great feast of the church. These are the men and women who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. They are the ones who have taken up their crosses and followed Jesus. They are the ones whose lives most clearly reflected His. And because of their faith and perseverance the church honors them collectively on this day. It is not necessarily easy to embrace the thought of imitating the lives of "saints" plural. So we frequently attach our thoughts to one or another of these witnesses whose life may have special meaning for us because of what they said or did. But since we cannot possibly honor them all individually, the church sets out this one day every year to honor them all. Regardless of how each of us may choose to venerate saints or any particular saint, it is a practice the church has long considered worthy of imitation. If you do not have a particular saint who inspires you by his or her life to follow the Lord in a particularly impressive way I would suggest you find one. The great cloud of witnesses is cheering you on.

November 1 is also the final day of Daylight Saving Time this year. On Saturday, October 31, please turn your clocks back one hour before you go to sleep. For those of you who can actually sleep an extra hour there is that additional blessing on All Saints' Day.

Election Day

Tuesday, November 3, is an election day. This year we are voting on eleven amendments to the state's constitution. I realize that constitutional amendments are not the most exciting thing to draw potential voters to the polls and that some of these things are nearly unintelligible to the majority of voters. But not voting shouldn't be an option. If you surrender your right to vote, you allow the few to rule. That is never a good thing in a democratic republic. Check out what's on the ballot and vote on Election Day if you have not already done so during early voting.

Thanksgiving Day

Thursday, November 26, is Thanksgiving Day. As is our custom, we will celebrate Holy Communion that morning at 10:00 am. In difficult times it is sometimes not easy to come up with something for which to be thankful. But that should not be the case. Look around you. Your life, your family, your friends are reasons to give thanks, just for starters. I'll bet that if you spend some time in prayer you can come up with lots of blessings you may never have thought of before now. Why don't you plan on joining us on Thanksgiving morning before the other festivities You will be blessed if you do.
