# FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR - GOOD NEWS!

As some of you may know, St. Francis took out a \$605,000 mortgage in connection with the construction of our current 5,500 square foot building at 3401 Oak Creek Drive. This 25-year mortgage originated in 2016 and was originally amortized to be fully repaid by 2041. As of our scheduled May 2023 payment, our mortgage balance will be approximately \$300,000, or approximately 15 years of repayment ahead of the original terms. This would not have been possible without the generous contributions that have been made to the St. Francis Anglican Church Building Fund. Thanks to all of you that have contributed. Please consider designating future memorials, required minimum distributions from retirement plans, or other contributions to the St. Francis Anglican Church Building Fund.
