FR. AARON CAPPUCCI

On May 1, 2023 - exactly one year after Fr. Len's retirement - the Vestry voted unanimously to call Fr. Aaron Cappucci as the next Rector of St. Francis Anglican Church.

Fr. Cappucci grew up in the church, and with his father serving as pastor, has always served in the church in some capacity. He sensed a call to pastoral ministry while in high school. While attending Bob Jones University in South Carolina, he and Pam met. After graduation and being married, they moved to Philadelphia where he attended Westminster Theological Seminary and received a Master of Divinity in 2017 and a Master of Theology - Apologetics in 2020 with a goal of pastoral ministry. They discovered the richness of Anglicanism at St. Mark's Reformed Episcopal Church in Rydal PA where they were confirmed. Fr. Cappucci became a Fellow at St. Mark's throughout his seminary years and was ordained to the diaconate in November in 2019 and to the presbyterate in June 2022.

In addition to his duties as Curate at St. Mark's Reformed Episcopal Church, he worked as the Senior Admission Manager at Westminster Theological Seminary, and as Admission Counselor the preceding four years.

After 11 years in the Philly area, Fr. Aaron was looking for employment opportunities in Texas, as Pam's family is in the Houston area. He found St. Francis by looking at a newsletter posted on our website and noticed we had an interim rector and was delighted to see that Fr. Andrew Brummett was associated with us. Having known Fr. Andrew while the Brummetts lived in the Philadelphia area, he gave Fr. Andrew a call to find out more about St. Francis. In a bit of astonishment at the timeliness of the call, Fr. Andrew put him in touch with Senior Warden, Doug Cooper. The members of the search committee were intrigued with Fr. Cappucci at the first Zoom meeting. After a couple of other Zoom meetings and personal meetings, the search committee unanimously voted to

recommend Fr. Cappucci to the Vestry as the next Rector. Of course, Bishop Reed was updated and provided his approval at each step on the way.

Fr. Cappucci and Pam have had four children, two of whom have preceded them into glory (Phinehas and Cecelia), while Francesca (4 years) and Elijah (10 months) continue to complete their joy. They are excited to begin planting roots in Austin and are eager to see how the Lord continues to expand his kingdom in and through St. Francis Anglican Church.

Fr. Cappucci and Pam will visit St. Francis on June 11 when Bishop Reed is here for confirmation and his annual Episcopal visit. Fr. Cappucci begins work as Rector on Monday, July 17 and will first preach and celebrate the Holy Communion on Sunday, July 23.

Thanks to all who included the rector search in their prayers that God's will be done. Kudos to the members of the search committee who spent many hours in Zoom meetings and phone calls on this topic in the past year: Praise to God that the whole process was completed with a calmness that shows God's hand in the deliberations.

BISHOP'S VISIT

Bishop Ryan Reed is coming to St. Francis on June 11 for his annual visit. This year, Fr. Rogers has prepared four adults for confirmation. The Bishop will receive into this communion anyone who has been confirmed in another by a bishop in apostolic orders. If anyone would like to reaffirm their commitment in the Anglican Church, Bishop Reed will accept that reaffirmation. Please let Fr. Rogers know as soon as possible if you fit into one of these two categories: reception or reaffirmation.

The St. Clare's Guild is planning a reception after the 11:00 service to welcome the Bishop to St. Francis.
