The theme that I have addressed in our two most recent Newsletters is the whole of Scripture for the whole of life. This was one of the themes that was emphasized as I was called as your rector and an area of continued discussion with the vestry. In particular, it was stressed that there is a great desire for Christian education in the parish (i.e., adult Sunday School).

There have been additional conversations regarding greater use of the Prayer Book in our corporate worship on Sunday's and family worship throughout the week (i.e., the Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer). Adult Sunday School and the Daily Offices bring the whole counsel of God to the whole of our lives.

And so, it is with great excitement that I am happy to announce that we will begin Adult Sunday School (or Sunday School for all) beginning on January 7, 2024 – the first Sunday in Epiphany and of 2024.

During Sunday School, we will be able to dive deeper into the study of God's Word through the Old and New Testaments, biblical and systematic theology, apologetics, church history, liturgics, thematic studies, and much more. This will provide further instruction in the Christian Faith for new Christians or seasoned saints. It will allow us to explore God's Word together in a manner different than preaching. RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS

Several of our members that are of an age where they are subject to Required Minimum Distributions on their retirement accounts have been utilizing the advantageous tax break of having some of these amounts transferred directly from their retirement accounts to St. Francis as a contribution. This is advantageous as St. Francis receives the full amount of the distribution and the donor is not required to pay federal income taxes on the distribution. NOVEMBER WEEKDAY CELEBRATIONS

All Saints Day - 7 pm, Wednesday, Nov. 1st. Said Holy Communion. This celebration was put in place to honor all those who do not have their own individual celebration such as our patron, St. Francis (October 4). Everyone who has reached the dignity of heaven is considered a saint, a Sanctus, which means holy. There is a tradition in our church, as in many others, that we honor all those who have gone before us and who have given us an example of how to live a life modeled after Jesus' life.

Thanksgiving Day - 10 am, Thursday, Nov. 23rd. A Holy Communion Service with hymns and other singing will be held. Thanksgiving Day is not a Holy Day per se, but it is an opportunity to take time to give thanks to God for His many blessings. In the times in which we find ourselves, many may not feel particularly blessed. We all get that. But think about it: the richness of God's mercy alone is reason enough to spend an hour worshiping the God who created, redeemed and sanctified us so that we are able to worship Him in spirit and in truth.
